

B. Use the initials of your farm name or your own name + the animal's registration number.

Sunny Knoll Farm = SKF #####

owner Sue Randall = SR #####

C. Use the initials of your farm name or your own name + a letter of the alphabet for the year + a number for the order of calves born on your farm that year.

Sunny Knoll Farm, year 2000 (letter J), 1st calf born on your farm this year (1) =

SKF J1

owner Sue Randall, year 2000 (letter J), 1st calf born on your farm this year (1) =

SR J1

The 2nd calf born would be J2, the 3rd J3, etc. The year 2001 would use the letter K, 2002 the letter L, etc.

If you have a question about your choice or need help, please contact the Secretary/Registrar.

4. If you are not sure of the paternal and maternal grandparents, the Secretary/Registrar can fill in that information.
5. A combined registration and transfer can be sent directly to the new owners if you wish. Include a written request for this service with the paperwork, along with the new owner's name, address, telephone number, and date of sale.

Registration of Embryo Transfers and Frozen Embryos

1. Each offspring resulting from either means shall have a certificate of Embryo Recovery sent directly to the Secretary/Registrar of the American Milking Devon Association. This certificate shall account for each embryo recovered and its ownership.
2. Any frozen embryo sold will require that a written transfer of ownership and bill of sale be filed with the application for registration of resulting offspring together with a copy of the original Certificate of Embryo Recovery.
3. The American Milking Devon Association Directors will have final say on any registration. The offspring registered will have "ET" appear on the registration following the animal's name. Appropriate fees will apply.

Transfers

Transfer of ownership is the seller's responsibility.

When new owners are given the paperwork to register or transfer the cattle they have purchased, they often neglect to send in the paperwork. The Association doesn't know these people exist, and so we lose track of the animal. **DO NOT** give the Certificate of Registration to the new owners and tell them to send it in. This is your responsibility as the seller.

To transfer ownership:

Return the red and white Certificate of Registration to the Secretary/Registrar with the appropriate fees, along with the following information:

Date of sale

Name, address and telephone number of the new owner

Please specify whether the new Certificate of Registration is to be returned to the seller or sent directly to the new owner.

AMDA WEBSITE

IF YOU ARE SELLING

Please send the Secretary/Registrar information on cattle you have for sale, so that inquiries can be directed to you.

IF YOU ARE SHOWING MILKING DEVONS

A list of breed characteristics is available from the Secretary/Registrar if you are planning to show your cattle at fair competitions or in 4-H. One important requirement: Milking Devons must be horned to show in the ring.
